From the Director: Ann Halloran, OP

There are many new directions developing at the Center, which I trust you would like to hear about. As we become more and more identified as a neighborhood center, we become more and more committed to attending to grassroots neighborhood development. One of the new developments for us is housing rehab assistance for the Dominican Center senior homeowners. The seniors provide a stabilizing neighborhood spirit by eagerness to create a strong, beautiful and secure community. Thus we see that attention to their needs can only produce positive results. Presently we are working with 14 senior families with the goal of assisting them to bring their home up to code within the year. It is a program whereby the Center will provide some matching funds, labor and professional expertise.

Next, we are pleased and excited with our increasing partnership with Habitat for Humanity. During the next three years, Habitat will construct 25 new homes in the Dominican Center area. Already five are nearly finished. Since we have such similar philosophies, our organizations work together well, reinforcing each other's mission. Habitat provides new homes. The Dominican Center provides a strong neighborhood organization. We are planning that the 10 homes constructed in 2009 will house Dominican Center members. At the same time, we are inviting families in homes built in 2007 and 2008 to become an integral part of the Dominican Center's program, which provides education, resources, community organization and ongoing homeownership education.

Finally and happily, we have been privileged to be chosen by Professional Dimensions, the largest organization of professional business women in Wisconsin, as their Charitable Fund Project. The Dominican Center was nominated by Anne Curley of Curley Communication and Margaret Henningsen of Legacy Bank. Professional Dimensions' support will enable the Center to increase the ratio of homeowners to renters in the neighborhood. By helping motivated women and their families to become qualified homebuyers, Professional Dimensions can play a key role in helping them rise from poverty to economic stability. According to Charitable Fund Board Chair Terry Peterson:

"This represents an opportunity for PD to make a real difference, not only with our dollars but with our advocacy and expertise."



My name is Georgniana Bond. I was born in Mississippi on January 11, 1938. I went through life, couldn't read, couldn't write. I just followed my instincts and relied on God. By coming to the Dominican Center I learned to read and write. The

All at the Center send you our best wishes with the deep hope that peace will come soon and the rough ways will be smoothed. Always, we are grateful for your support!

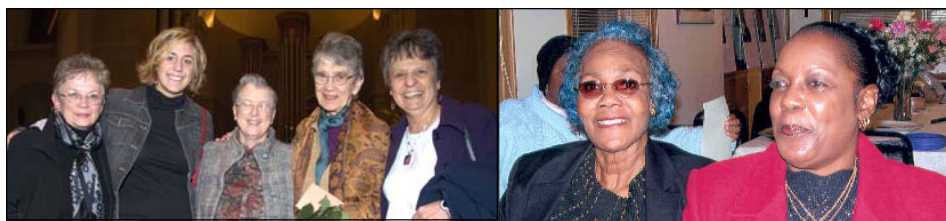
