It's been a few months since I became the new executive director at the Dominican Center, and I've been enjoying getting to know everyone. One of my favorite parts of the day is when the students, tutors, volunteers and staff all get together to share a meal. I love listening to the sounds of conversation and laughter shared-there's a very real sense of caring and community here at the Center.

Adult education classes began in September, and we have a very full house this semester, with over 26 students and 14 volunteer tutors. We are so grateful to our tutors, who help us provide one-on-one instruction to our women (and a few men!). There is still need for a few additional tutors, so if you are interested in volunteering your time to work with our students, please give us a call.

The computer and writing classes are also at capacity this semester. We are pleased to share some articles authored by some of our writing students in this newsletter.

Our rehab staff is busy getting as much exterior work done as possible while the weather is still mild enough to be outdoors, but soon they'll be moving indoors to continue working with low-income seniors who need help with interior repairs on their homes. Are you handy with a hammer or a paint brush and would like to give of some of your time to assist our homeowners? We are putting together a volunteer group to work one or two weekdays on rehab projects in our neighborhood, and would love to have you join us.

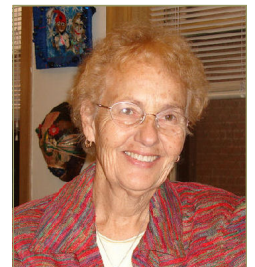

“New Computers” - Thanks to the generosity of our friends at UWM—Milwaukee and the Bader Foundation, we have been the recipients of 5 laptop and 4 desktop computers. The laptop computers will be used to enhance our education program by still providing our one-on-one tutoring, but utilizing educational software to provide some additional challenges and incorporate some fun, too. The laptop computers should be fully integrated into our educational program by the start of the spring semester. The plan for the desktop computers is to provide practical business application experience. While this plan is still evolving, it too, will be in place by the spring semester.

24th St/24th Pl Initiative - We are proud to report that security lighting and new mailboxes have been installed on 19 homes. The Dominican Center hosted the “Lighting Up the Neighborhood” event on Saturday, October 2. Weatherization kits were distributed to each house on 24th St and 24th Pl. Representatives from the City of Milwaukee were also present.

The Garden - The garden is done for the year...a sure sign that the colder seasons of fall and winter are on their way. Folks in the neighborhood enjoyed the produce: cabbage, onions, carrots, tomatoes, beans, peppers, all sorts of greens and, of course the marigolds. The green tomatoes were an especially big hit! The young people of Hephatha Lutheran Church, as part of their work ministry, were the caretakers of the garden under the guidance of Doris, Katrina and Sr. Sue. We thank all of our wonderful benefactors who donated plants for the garden and the MSOE students who created the raised garden beds under the guidance of Nick, Tom and Sr. Ann.

Back to School Fair - Over 500 adults & children attended this year's Back to School Fair with over 300 book bags (filled with paper, pens, crayons, rulers, etc.) distributed, 40 children were researched by the City of Milwaukee Health Department resulting in 20 children tested for lead poisoning. There were games and contests that the children participated in to “earn” their book bags. Even McGruff, the police safety dog was present to help. A big thank you to Hupy & Abraham who were on hand to finger print children and give them ID cards. Residents were also given certificates for a free eye exam and free glasses. Drawings were held for gift cards and prizes donated by Milwaukee area businesses.

Education - We are extremely pleased with our education program. Last year we had a record enrollment of 22 students. This year we have a new record of 26 students. We are grateful to Mary Fran for her writing lab curriculum which she teaches two days a week. We also have a record number of tutors this year and we are so very blessed. The goal of six to eight of our students is to pass their GED tests in June 2011. Sister Stella has again filled to capacity her Monday and Wednesday computer classes.

Seniors Group - The first Intergenerational Breakfast of the year took place on Friday, October 8th. Nova High School Students and Seniors in the neighborhood collaborated in an attempt to break down intergenerational barriers. Individuals shared their life experiences.



On July 15, two School Sisters of Notre Dame visited the center to learn of our ministry to the neighborhood. They live in a community in Kenya. One of them serves the needs of the children of families who are infected with HIV AIDS; and the other is studying for a degree in Mathematics. She is a high school teacher from Nigeria and will return in a year and a half.

Both the staff of the Dominican Center for Women, and several women from the neighborhood were present. We shared our experience of services we offer or have received. The Sisters told us the story of their ministry as well. This exchange of stories generated some wonderful conversations around the issues of the stigma attached to people living with HIV, and how education is done in both countries.

It was difficult to end our time together after lunch. We wanted to learn more and more about another culture. The Sisters reported that their lives will definitely be changed after their experiences here. We are all very grateful for this interchange among women of different backgrounds.
